## Best Wishes for the Festive Season and 2020

### ACA Bronze Medal

The weekend of 30 November saw eight of the state's top ranked AC players at Shepparton Croquet Club, vying for the Victorian Bronze Medal and the right to represent Victoria in the Gold Medal next March in Brisbane.

At the start of the final round of two days' round robin play, Kevin Beard (Yarrawonga) and Stephen Forster (Belmont) were both undefeated.

Both players were in fine form and the game would hinge on which player was better able to take advantage of their opportunities.

Kevin looked to be headed for a win after completing the three peels to set up a peg out. However he missed with his front ball. Kevin pegged off his other ball and left Stephen an opportunity to play a two-on-one game. The spectators were enthralled and the tactics kept all guessing. Kevin took his chance to shoot at the peg from the border between hoop one and hoop two. A miss could prove fatal with Stephen's balls lying in wait across the court. Kevin's shot hit the middle of the peg and for the second time in three seasons Kevin wins the Victorian Bronze Medal.

Kevin will now represent Victoria in the ACA Gold Medal where he will compete against the winners from the other five states.

Kenn Boal from Rich River finished third.

In the past month and in my capacity as an ex officio member of all Croquet Victoria sub-committees and working groups, I have attended meetings of the Mandatory Board Quota WG, the Strategic Plan 2021-25 WG, the Strategic Plan Implementation Sub-Committee and the interim Together More Active Sub-committee as well as both the GC and AC Selection Committees.

In November, I attended the Vicsport AGM and in December I attended the Vicsport CEO and Chair Forum which was designed to ensure that the CEOs and Chairs of State Sporting Associations are kept abreast and aware of matters that may impact their organisations.

Also, in December, Sandra Kastanaras and I attended an evening course required for liquor license nominees. One outcome of that course will be addressed further during the December Council meeting.

Further, I have met twice with Bruce Warlow, our auditor, to discuss details of the financial reports presented to Directors at each Council (and CoM) meeting.

Planning continues for the 2020 AC Worlds Championship and this is addressed further elsewhere in this edition.

Finally, I reiterate my earlier calls for someone to assume the role of State Coordinator of Association Croquet. It appears that most AC players and those clubs with a high proportion of AC players are very concerned with the gradual diminution of numbers playing the code, but there is only so much that Croquet Victoria can do without someone to coordinate it all.

**Removal of Trees and Garden Beds:** We have been unable to engage a contractor to undertake this work.

**Functions at VCC:** Whilst data is collected as to the profitability or otherwise for non-croquet functions at the Victorian Croquet Centre, bookings are suspended.

### VCA:

**Croquet Victoria Strategic Plan 2021-2025:** Thank you to those individuals, clubs and regions who provided feedback with regards to the Draft Strategic Plan Vision and Goals. As the Strategic Plan takes shape, drafts will be published on the Planning for Croquet page in the Resources section of the Croquet Victoria website. <https://croquetvic.asn.au/displaypage.php?ref=Planning%20for%20Croquet>

**Strategic Plan Implementation Sub-Committee:** We have received one nomination to this Sub-Committee. Training in the use of online meeting technology such as Skype is available if you are interested in joining this Sub-Committee or any other Sub-Committee where travel is an obstacle.

**Marketing and Publicity Sub-Committee Casual Vacancy:** Clubs were advised on 23 November 2019 that there was a casual vacancy on this Sub-Committee. To date no nominations have been received.

**State Coordinator of Association Croquet:** No nomination has been received.

**Review of Croquet Victoria Policies:** The Provision of Liquor and Catering at VCC Policy is currently being reviewed. The Croquet Victoria Child Safe Policy will be reviewed in 2020 along with the State Coordinator Job Descriptions.

**Clubs Child Safe Policy:** Nine clubs have yet to advise adoption of a club child safe policy.

**Seniors Festival 2019:** Clubs who notified us that they participated in this year's Festival had their share of grant funding paid into their club bank account. Thank you for your reports.

**Brimbank City Council Support of Gateball Australia Championship:** Brimbank City Council Festivals/Events Grants Program provided \$3719.10 to support this very successful event recently concluded at the Victorian Croquet Centre paying for an interpreter, entertainment and catering.

### **The Australian Association Croquet Open – Doubles and Singles**

The Australian Association Croquet Open – Doubles and Singles – was held at Cairnlea over 9 days in late November. This is one of the most prestigious events of the year. In recent years the entry level has dropped but the standard is still extremely high.

The event played in great spirit through a range of weather conditions. The eventual winner – Jenny Clarke NZ – was the dominant player of the championships. She did not lose a game in her progress from the qualifying Burrigidge Swiss event through to the final. Hence – a champion. Her opponent in the final was Simon Watkins (Brighton) who played some excellent croquet to reach the last match. The final was a best of 5 event which Jenny won in 3 straight games. The first of these games went right to the bell – a 3-hour game that Jenny won 24-23. Jenny won the next two games 26-4 and 26-9 to claim her 3<sup>rd</sup> Australian Open title.

Jenny and Trevor Bassett took out the doubles winning the final in an enthralling match with Stephen Forster and Kevin Beard. The third game saw Jenny and Trevor win the title for the second year in a row.

All pairings who missed the final moved to the plate. There was no clear-cut winning pair so two pairs – David Johnston/Jock Capobianco and Simon Watkins/Michael Wright were declared joint winners.

The support from the players in assisting with re-setting the courts twice during the event was much appreciated. The referees, under the control of Mike Cohn, Brian Foley, Lizzie Bassett and Steven Howes, did a sterling job. Some of the day's play was long and conditions varied from fine and calm to a howling wind and rain!! What else would you expect in Melbourne during Spring.

The social side of the event was well supported by the sponsorship of Parbery Consulting. An excellent BBQ was provided on two nights during the event. All players in the event were given a shirt by the sponsors and there was considerable prize money offered across the board. Our very sincere thanks to Nick Chapman for this generous support. ### **Good news for all players who want to improve their game!**

**Croquet Victoria has secured government funding for a new coaching programme, the Croquet Victoria Player Development Project.**

This will be similar to the very successful NSW initiative, which provides a pathway for players from 'foundation' to 'mastery'. Ours will consist of a sequence of three workshops per level, Beginner, Developing and Advanced, delivered around the state by our top coaches. The programme will also help train assistant coaches, as well as provide opportunities for competition in all levels of both GC and AC. A first for Victoria, the planned course of training will be repeated at regional clubs, so players don't have to come to Melbourne to access coaching at all skill levels.

Beginning soon, we will be calling for lead coaches, newer coaches and players who wish to be involved in this exciting new course. There will also be a call for clubs in all regions to bid for the opportunity to host a two-day workshop in their area, to enable their players and local coaches to take advantage of this training.

The first course to start will be Beginner workshops, which will be piloted in May/June, after preparation of the courses by the lead coaches. The next level, for Developing players will follow in August, and the Advanced workshops will begin in November. The full course will continue through 2021.



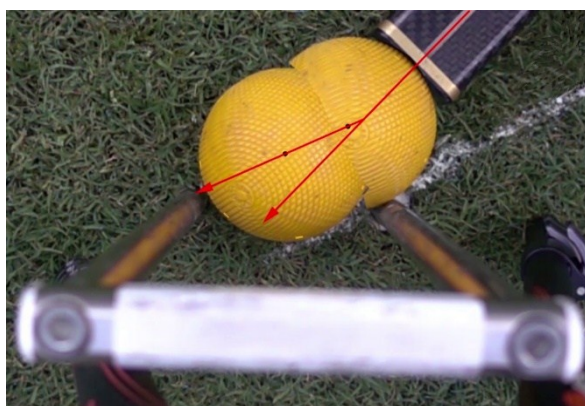
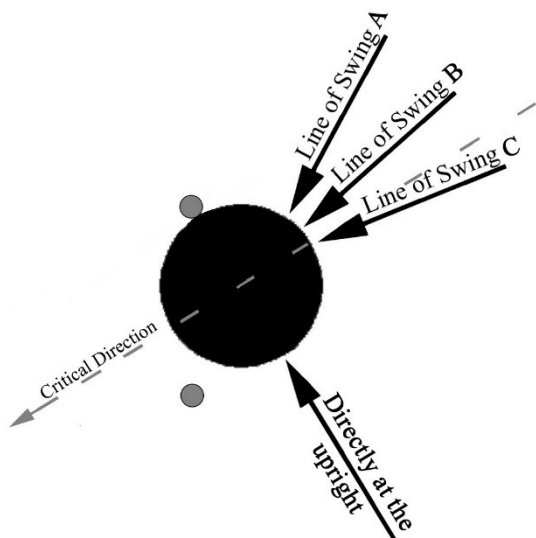
### **Playing a ball which is touching a hoop upright**

There's some confusion for players about how to avoid a hoop crush fault when their ball is touching a hoop upright, and for referees about how to judge what is and isn't a fault.

You need to play away from the upright that the ball is touching, but not necessarily away from the hoop itself. Playing away from an upright means playing in a direction that is at least 90 degrees from playing straight at the upright. See Figure 1. The ball is touching an upright in that diagram. Strokes with lines of swing A and B are away from the upright, but the stroke with line of swing C is into the upright and would, therefore, be a fault.

A “hoop crush” is said to occur if, during a stroke, the ball played is still in contact with the mallet when the ball touches a hoop upright. Some people equate the term “hoop crush” with “hoop crush fault”, but I want to distinguish between the situation (i.e. the conjunction of mallet, ball and hoop) and when it's a fault. Rules 11.2.6 and 11.2.7 don't use the term “hoop crush” but that is what they are about. They are also about ball crushes and peg crushes but, to keep this a bit simpler, let's just concentrate on hoop crushes.

Those rules effectively say

11.2.6. A hoop crush is a fault.

11.2.7. When a ball lies in contact with a hoop upright before a stroke, a hoop crush is a fault unless the ball was played away from that upright.

Rule 11.2.6 deals with hoop crushes in general, and Rule 11.2.7 deals with a special class of hoop crushes. The important thing to know is that for situations where a ball is initially in contact with a hoop upright, Rule 11.2.7 overrides Rule 11.2.6. That is consistent with the general principle in law that the specific prevails over the general.

Since strokes played with lines of swing A and B were away from the upright the ball was initially touching, they would not be ball crush faults, but a fault could occur for another reason. For example, if they were not played with minimal follow through, a double tap could occur. The referee would need to watch carefully for that, as well as whether the line of swing was away from the upright when observing the stroke. The ball would be unlikely to run the hoop for a stroke with line of swing A and, if a double tap occurred, it would be quite easy to see. It would be possible to run the hoop without faulting in a stroke with line of swing B. If a double tap did occur with the ball running the hoop, it could be quite hard to see. A method for judging such situations could be a story for another time.

There is a slow-motion video with link <https://youtu.be/xnFH1TcjyUE> which shows four strokes. Use the link or search for “BallTouchingUpright”. Stroke 1 in the video is one where the ball was touching an upright with the leading edge of the ball 25 mm past the plane of the playing side (as in Figure 1), The ball ran the hoop without faulting with the stroke played in direction B. The ball hit the other upright first and then hit the one the ball was originally in contact with. Double contact like that slows the ball down and increases the chances of a double tap. If the stroke had not been played with such little follow through, a double tap would probably have occurred in a situation like this.

### Playing a ball which is touching a hoop upright

For stroke 2 in the Youtube video, the ball was also touching an upright but in this case the ball was just over 5 mm further into the hoop. That may not seem to be much of a difference in position, but it makes the stroke much easier to play without faulting. It was possible for the ball to run the hoop by glancing off only the other upright. There was no hoop crush and no double tap even though the stroke was played with considerable force and follow through.

For strokes 3 and 4 in the video, the ball is only just into the jaws of the hoop when touching an upright. Running the hoop would be impossible but putting the ball further into the jaws of the hoop is not too difficult if the player is careful not to commit a hoop crush fault. In stroke 3 the player was not careful, and a fault was committed, but stroke 4 was clean. A referee would know if a hoop crush fault occurred by observing the line of swing relative to the critical direction. Also, when a hoop crush fault occurs, an immediate change in direction of the path of the ball can be seen. Without a hoop crush fault, the ball continues to travel in the direction of the line of swing for at least a centimetre or two. See Figure 2 which shows the path of the ball for stroke 3.

I hope this article has helped players know when running a hoop without faulting is possible if the striker's ball is touching a hoop upright, and helped referees know whether or not a fault has occurred if a stroke is played in that situation.

School teams from Wanganui Park Secondary College, Shepparton High School, GV Grammar School and Euroa Secondary College entered teams to play in the tournament, held Monday 2nd December at the Shepparton croquet courts. As we can't plan for the weather we were worried when storms, wind, rain and hail was forecast. We did have four seasons in one day on Monday! The students were very resilient when a shower was a bit heavier for a few minutes, as only a couple of teams sheltered out of the rain, then play continued.

The students were very excited to get the games started and for some teams to have only just learnt the game called 'Golf Croquet', (christened by students last year as the "Rock and Roll" game of the discipline!), we witnessed some outstanding play and close games.

We were again grateful that the local Goulburn Murray Credit Union (GMCU), sponsored the day and the students were fortunate to graze on delicious home made Egg and Bacon Pies and Sausage Rolls with fruit platters all day.

Two games were played in the morning and each game went for at least 1 hour to 1 hour and half, meaning that every hoop was strongly fought for. We were extremely impressed how strategic the students were protecting their partners ball ready to hoop or hitting the oppositions ball away from the hoop so they could get the hoop. There was a lot of cat and mouse play going on and it was exciting to watch. Then followed a BBQ lunch with hungry students lining up to warm up with food from the cold. Two more games were played and the final winners had to be decided whilst a delicious Afternoon Tea of slices and cakes was served.
