2 Our Community's Funding Centre

From 2 January 2019 \$125.00 per year will get a not-for-profit organisation membership to The Funding Centre (Our Community) and members receive the monthly newsletter Funding Centre Scoop, which lists details of opportunities for grants from all three sectors – governments, foundations and businesses.

Members of the Funding Centre also have access to the Funding Centre grants database.

This website has a Help Centre available to members, dealing with such topics as applying a 'gender lens' to your work - There are two excellent reasons why not-for-profits should apply a gender lens to their work.

- First, doing so will mean your work is fairer (because all potential beneficiaries are considered and included) and more effective (because your activities will be better targeted).
- Second, not-for-profits are increasingly being asked by funders, and by the public at large, to demonstrate that they have taken account of the persistent biases in society – in what they are, and in what they do. In time, your funding might depend on getting it right.
